1. ANNOUNCEMENT

- 1.1 AUSX Events Pty Ltd hereafter called the Promoter will conduct the 2026 Australian Supercross Championship for the following championship classes; SX1, SX2, SX3 and Junior 85cc.

2. JURISDICTION

- 2.1 The Australian Supercross Championship has been authorised by Motorcycling Australia (MA). Motorcycling Australia (MA) has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit & FIM International Meeting Numbers listed on page 1 of these regulations and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia Senior National, Junior National Licenses.
- 2.2 All Competitors MUST be Supercross endorsed.
- 2.3 Junior Riders must produce their logbook.
- 2.4 Competitors licensed by other federations (FMN's) are eligible to enter providing they have the appropriate FIM License and start permission from their FMN. Australian Riders will require an FIM license for international rounds.
- 2.5 Each event will be held in accordance with the ASX Sporting Regulations, General Competition Rules (GCRs) contained in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport (MoMS), these Supplementary Regulations, and any Final Instructions. By entering the event all parties agree to comply with these rules, regulations, by-laws, and instructions.
- 2.6 Motorcycling New Zealand (MNZ) has authorised Round 1 in New Zealand to form part of the Australian Supercross Championship.

4. ENTRIES

- 4.2 Riders may enter whilst waiting for their SX endorsement but will not be able to race or sign on at event unless endorsed. SX endorsement must be uploaded to RiderNet and approved prior to entries closing.

6. ENTRY PASSES + TICKETING

- 6.1 Entry fee includes two passes as follows: 2 passes = 1 competitor and 1 mechanic
- 6.2 Team personnel who require track access must hold an MA crew licence or Senior National Competition licence (if domestic crew within Australia), or an FIM Event licence (if non-domestic).
- 6.3 Additional tickets will be available for purchase via ausxsupercross.com.au

7. INSURANCE

- 7.1 Refer to the Sporting Regulations for details on insurance
- 7.2 All international crew will require an FIM Crew Licence which can be utilised across all events

8. MEDICAL SERVICES

- 8.1 Refer to the Sporting Regulations for details on medical services
- 8.2 Medical forms will be supplied via ausxsupercross.com.au and must be fully completed and lodged with officials at rider sign in.

9. SIGN-ON

- 9.1 Riders must present the self-scrutineering form at sign on with all details completed. Details of sign-on will be outlined in the Final Instructions. Riders under the age of 18 MUST have their parent/legal guardian present with them at sign on.

12. STARTS

- 12.1 All starts will be made with a self-penalising, mechanical, backward-falling gate, a maximum of 18 round gates for all rounds. Jumping or fouling the gate may result in a time penalty, exclusion or both.

13. RACE FORMAT

- 13.1 Practice and Qualifying will take place on the day of racing unless otherwise advised in the Final Instructions.
- 13.2 Riders will be split into two groups at the first event; thereafter seeded and non-seeded groups will be formed from current Championship standings.
- 13.3 Last Chance Qualifiers (LCQ) will only be run for all classes where a minimum of 12 riders can take to the grid, or the top 9 from each heat will move to the Final.
- 13.4 Race Formats will operate as follows per race class and any alterations will be advised in the Final Instructions.

14. EVENT SCHEDULE & OPERATIONS

- 14.1 An Operations Manual will be distributed within 3 weeks of the event, and the event schedule will be provided with the Final Instructions document.

15. AWARDS AND PRIZE MONEY

- 15.1 Trophies (or plaques) will be awarded to all classes at each round.
- 15.2 The top eighteen (18) riders in SX1, SX2 and top five (5) in SX3 will receive prize money per round, as per the Prize Money Schedule. The Promoter is responsible for the payment of all prize money. All prize money is in AUD.
- 15.3 PAYG Withholding affects the payment of prize money. If you do not provide an ABN or declare the sport is a hobby, the Promoter must withhold 46.5% of prize money over \$50.00 which is otherwise payable to you
- 15.4 Invoice proforma and prize money schedule are available at ausxsupercross.com.au.
- 15.5 Prize money will be paid at the completion of the series and is required to be invoiced in full
- 15.6 All invoices can be submitted online via ausxsupercross.com.au prior to the 31 December 2026. Prize monies will not be claimable after this date and will be voided by the entrant.
- 15.7 Prize money will be payable by the Promotor within 14 days of receiving the invoice.

16. RIDING NUMBERS

- 16.1 Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their registered riding number or their preferred riding number. All other numbers will be allocated at the discretion of the Promoter in consultation with Motorcycling Australia.
- 16.2 All number plates on all machines MUST comply with the current MoMS (8.15.1).

17. GRID POSITIONS

- 17.1 Timed Qualifying sessions will be conducted to determine the order in which gates are selected by the rider for the Heats.
- 17.2 The fastest Rider will be granted first pick for a gate in the second heat. The second fastest qualifier will be granted first gate pick in the first heat, the third fastest qualifier will be granted the second gate pick in heat two and so on until all qualifying Riders are placed in a heat race.
- 17.3 Gate Pick Final will be determined by the fastest heat. The winner from this heat will be granted first gate pick. The winner from the slowest heat will be granted second gate pick, the second finisher of the fastest heat will be granted third gate pick in the final and so on until all qualified riders are placed.
- 17.4 Where Superpole forms part of the event schedule, the Gate Pick Final will be determined by the fastest to slowest times in the Superpole. 11-20 will be determined from the heat races. Superpole will be advised via the schedule.

18. PRESENTATIONS + PRESS CONFERENCES

- 19.1 Riders who finish on the podium at each round must attend the presentation, TV interview and post event press conference / scrum at each event. Riders are required to familiarise themselves with the podium process outlined in the operations manual. Timing and location for post event press conference will be included in the Final Instructions.
- 19.2 Failure to attend may incur a fine and possible suspension of MA racing licence until such time the fine is paid. Minimum dress standard will be applicable (Televised presentations).

19. FACILITIES

- 19.1 Catering facilities will be available at all venues – refer to Final Instructions for more information.

20. ADMISSION CHARGES

- 20.1 Ticket prices for the public may vary from event to event, ticketing information can be found at ticketmaster.com.au

21. RIDER PADDOCK (PIT AREA)

- 21.1 The rider paddock area will be open to the public during designated hours at Geelong and Newcastle locations.
- 21.2 As the event areas are restricted there will be no large trailer access E.g. Base Stations / Motor homes, these will be directed to the general car park zone after unloading.
- 21.3 **Further detail on pit area requirements will be provided in Final Instructions along with paddock allocations.**
